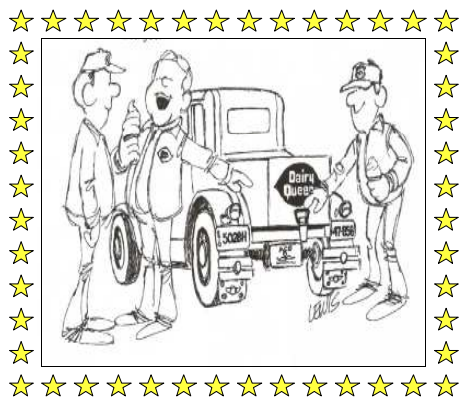

Minutes of Monthly Meeting – October 3, 2006**

The monthly meeting of the CCMAFC was convened at the Seven Points Dairy Queen at 5:30 PM on Tuesday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Nineteen people were present, with eight Model A's being driven to the meeting (Walt and Virginia, Sue and Bill, Shorty, Mary, Don and Shirley, Robert and Imogene, Eddie and Charles and Janelle).

The meeting was called to order by the President, Joe Creecy, who led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Old Business- The minutes of the September 5<sup>th</sup> meeting were read by Shirley Dyess. Mary Worman made a motion to accept the minutes as written, Janelle Seabourne seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously. Shirley also read the Financial Report for the month of September.
