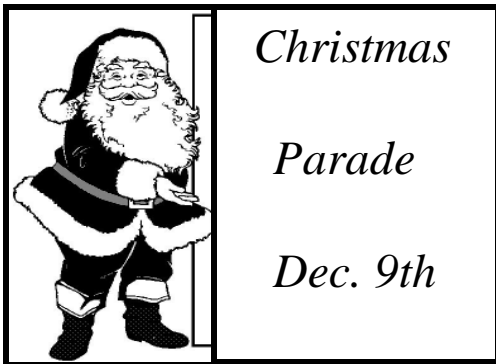

- 1 cup self-rising flour
- 1 tablespoon mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Mix all ingredients well. Melt a pat of butter in each cup of a muffin or cupcake pan (six muffin size). Evenly divide batter over melted butter. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, approximately 20 minutes. Makes six rolls.

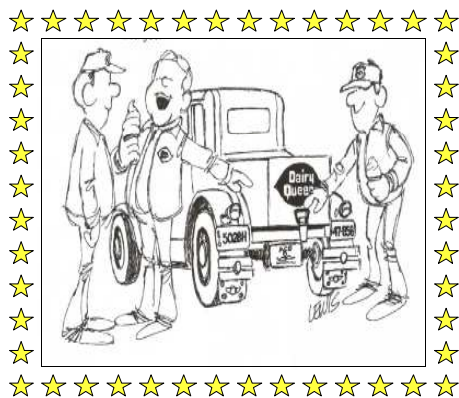
Line up off HWY 198 on the North Side of the Gun Barrel City Fire Station. Parade will start between 5:30 and 6:00 Pm. When it's dark.

Minutes of Monthly Meeting - November 7, 2006

The monthly meeting of the CCMAFC was convened at the Seven Points Dairy Queen at 5:30 PM on Tuesday, November 7th. Eighteen people were present, with six Model A's being driven to the meeting (Walter, Sue and Bill, Shorty, Don and Shirley, Ola, and Charles and Janelle). The meeting was called to order by the President, Joe Creecy, who led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Old Business- The minutes of the October 3rd meeting were read by Shirley Dyess. John Bell made a motion to accept the minutes as written, Clark Clay seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously. Shirley also read the Financial Report for the month of October.

Joe Creecy asked that the members vote on the final form of the amended By-Laws. John Bell inquired whether the Vice-President for the current year was expected to pass to the President position in the following year, which had previously been the understanding but had never been included in the By-Laws. Since the amended By-Laws provide that all three officers for the current year will serve as directors for the following year (unless they are re-elected or are otherwise unable to serve), it was agreed that the question of the Vice-President ascending to the President position would be resolved on a case-by-case basis and would not be included in the By-Laws. The membership also agreed that they did not want to limit terms for any position on the Board of Directors. The membership voted to accept the amended By-Laws as written.

Joe Creecy asked that everyone sign a list for Mary Worman showing how many calendars they would want for 2007, so that she can decide whether it is worthwhile to print them again this year.

Shirley announced that since we are so close to the end of the year our Directory would reflect a 2007 date and will include the new Board of Directors.

New Business - Bill Capps announced the Nominating Committee's choices for the 2007 Board of Directors: Sue Capps for President; Walt Hellebrand for Vice-President; Shirley Dyess for Secretary-Treasurer; and Charles Seabourne, Joe Creecy and John Bell for Directors. He asked for any nominations from the floor, and since there were none asked that the members vote for the entire slate. The vote was unanimous, and Joe Creecy offered congratulations to the candidates on their new positions.

Robert Needham won the Mystery Raffle for November. Robert had brought to the meeting a set of parade flags for a door prize, and Gene Tregre won these nice flags in a second drawing.

November events include breakfast on the 11th at Mom's in Mabank, and a trip to Big Rock for a picnic lunch on the 13th. The Christmas brunch will be December 2nd at the Lake Ridge RV Park from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, including a White Elephant gift exchange and collection of Toys for Tots. If any of our group are musicians, they should bring their instruments for a sing-a-long. The Gun Barrel City Christmas parade will be December 9th at 5:30 PM (line up at 4:30 PM). Bill Capps mentioned the John Burke auction in Winnsboro on November 18th.

Sunshine Report - Sue announced that Virginia had just gone for her second chemo treatment and seemed to be doing well. Ola said he would be going back for treatment soon. Clark Clay and Janelle Seabourne received birthday congratulations (Mary Worman and Erma Reynolds had November birthdays but were not present).

There will be no regular December meeting because of the Christmas party, but instead we will have a short business meeting at the party. Don Dyess made a motion for adjournment and Paul Pirtle seconded the motion.
