PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

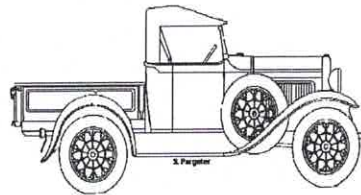

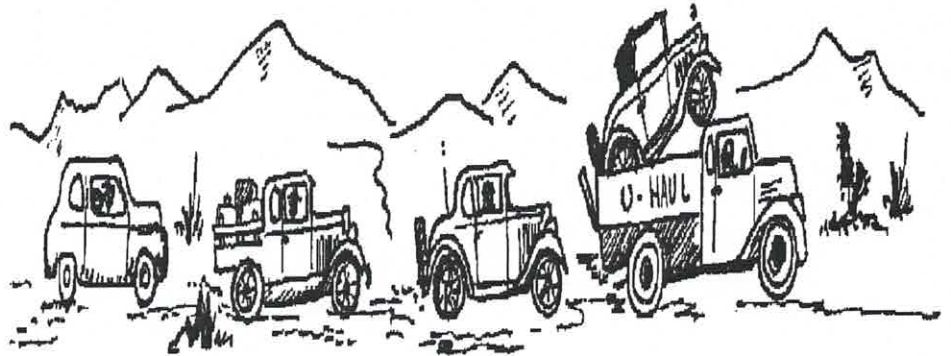
ODE TO CLARK AND JUDY CLAY

Tech Tips

Have you ever removed the coil wire and discovered one of the metal ends is in the distributor cap or coil?

Here is an easy fix. Take the two tips off the wire. Where the metal end has a triangle shape bent in toward the wire, bend flat with a punch. Make a small dent, then drill a hole using a 1/16" or 5/64" drill bit. It may be easier to just cut the triangle shaped piece off.

At about 3/32" from the end, remove the wire insulation. Now place the metal tip over the exposed wire.

Thread the wires though the hole you made in the metal tip. Spread the exposed wires radial from the center, bending the wires flat. Solder the wires to the tip making a dome shape of solder.

Pop-out switches become sticky as they age. Before you junk the switch or possible breaking the key off in the switch, try this solution. Turn the key until the switch pops out. Under the first "F" in the word "Off" drill a 1/16" hole carefully through the brass shell.

Now using Berryman's B-12 Chemtool in the spray can. Insert plastic tube in the hole and spray. This will cut the gum. Once you are satisfied the area is degummed, lube with light oil.

A word of caution, be careful not to get B-12 Chemtool on painted surfaces.
