#### NAME AND PURPOSE

This club shall be known as the Cedar Creek Model A Ford Club, a non-profit organization, hereinafter referred to as the "Club."

The purpose shall be to maintain, preserve and restore the vehicle known as the Model A Ford (1928-1931) and all things pertaining to the Model A Ford, including literature, historical and technical information.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**



### Fall is Here!

Fall is marked by the autumnal equinox, a time when Earth's tilt causes the Northern Hemisphere to lean away from the sun, resulting in shorter, cooler days and changing leaf colors.

During this season, animals migrate or prepare for hibernation, while many cultures observe harvest festivals like Thanksgiving and Halloween.

Other tidbits include the origin of the name "fall" from "the fall of the leaves," the tradition of carving jack-o'-lanterns from turnips instead of pumpkins, and a potential increase in stargazing due to clearer, less humid air.

Fact #1: Americans typically refer to this time of year as "fall," while the British use the word "autumn." Both terms date back to the 16th century but before that it was called "harvest.

Fact #2: Fall was called "harvest" because of the "harvest moon" that occurs when the full moon is closest to the autumn equinox.

Stargazing: Fall's longer nights and clearer, less humid air make it an excellent time for stargazing.

Taurid Meteor Shower: The Taurid meteor shower, which occurs in mid -autumn, is known for producing spectacular fireballs as larger pieces of debris burn up in Earth's atmosphere

# **Historical Tidbit**

# **Knowing Your Model A True or False**

From the Columbia Crier of the Columbia Basin Model a Club in Tri-Cities, Washington.

Each month we endeavor to ask a few questions to see if you are aware of the parts on your Model A and just maybe how they work. I hope you find this month's questions and answers both interesting and thought provoking.

#### **QUESTIONS**

- 1. Ford was the first car manufacturer to install Dome lights in all Coupes, Sedans and Town Cars.
- 2. Although the design of the Stop Light Switch assembly was different between the 1928-29 and 1930-31 models they still mounted on the Transmission.
- 3. Fans type 1 were a steel, two-blade, welded double thickness propeller type with a hollow center manufactured by Ford, the type 2 were a steel, single thickness blade manufactured by Holley.
- 4. All Model A's cars and pickup trucks came with a ten (10) leaf front spring.
- 5. The Gas Gauge shield (gas level indicator opening) had a vertical oval opening in the 1928 to early 1930 models and a round opening for late 1930-31 models.

#### **ANSWERS**

- False Wiring for the Dome lights in Deluxe Coupes, Standard Fordor Sedans, Town Sedans, and Town Cars were routed from the Terminal Box and up the Driver's side front door post. All other vehicles did not have Dome lights.
- 2. False Stop Light switches for the 1928 29 vehicles were mounted to the Transmission and for the 1930 31 vehicles were mounted to middle cross member.
- 3. True There were two types/shapes of Fans designed and installed on the Model A Ford. Most of the Fans were of the Ford Design.
- 4. 4. True The front springs carried the weight of the Engine, Chassis, Radiator, etc. which all weighted the same. The number of rear springs varied from 7 to 10 springs based on the weight of the body since Roadster bodies were fairly in comparison to the heavier Sedan bodies.
- 5. False There were three (3) designs of the Gas Gauge shield (gas level indicator opening) plates: vertical Oval Dec 1927 – May 1928, horizontal Oval June 1928 – May 1929, and round opening May 1929 Dec 1931.

# Technical Tips

#### TECHNICAL TALK: with Paul Winchester

#### It's Shocking!

What a shock it's October already. The Fall Equinox is behind us, Halloween is right around the corner.


On occasion you should crawl under the Model A just to have a look around, don't do this right after lunch or you may fall asleep laying on the cool garage floor, take a grease gun with you so you can grease the fittings you find. Also check for oil stains on the floor under where the shocks are.

The shocks are those round things bolted to the frame just above the brake drum with an arm and link down to the axle. If the shock links are loose, tighten them up with the screw plug on the top of the link. Be sure to reinstall a cotter pin or the screw will come loose. (See drawing right)


If the shocks are leaking oil, you will need to add some shock oil, remove the square nut plug and add oil until it runs out, then replace the screw plug. This oil can be purchased from any Model A parts supplier or use hydraulic jack oil. The original oil in 1928 was Glycerin.

If your shocks are missing or non-operational you might want to look into changing to new tube shocks, as the tube shocks could be cheaper

than rebuilding the old ones. There are a couple of types of tube shocks, ask around and you will get information from other club members who have already made this change. (Tube Shock installation example drawing Left)

I am still using the stock Model A shocks as they are still working.

There is a good chapter in the Red "Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook" by Les Andrews about removing and repairing Model A Shocks. The Model A Restoration and Judging Standards book has chapter 23 dedicated to shocks and shackles. There were nine different shock bodies made for Model A's. Having the right one is worth 20 points for judging. I don't know if mine are the right ones for my year of car, but they work, so I am using them.

A Little Trivia, a guy named Lloyd Copeman who was about 10 years younger than Henry Ford both growing up on farms in Michigan, and also worked for a time at Edison in Detroit, made quite a few inventions and had about 600 patents. A couple of them were, 1912 the Electric Stove, his invention was the heat control switch, and another one in 1928, the flexible ice cube tray, and best of all, his Granddaughter was Linda Ronstadt.

# What Causes That To Happen?

We think that our perfect Model A should be running smoothly and not rattle. (but that doesn't always happen).

PROBLEM – CAR/TRUCK SAFETY FUSE BLOWS – Sometimes the Safety Fuse (when installed) blows when the Horn is being used, when the lights are being turned on or the car is turning a corner or stopping.

NORMAL SETUP – Many owners install a Safety Fuse to prevent the wiring from shorting out or when excessive amperage/current is present in the wiring/components which can drain the battery and/or start their car on fire. Wires having a chafed insulation area with an exposed wire at places such as the wiring frame clips and Headlight flex conduits are common on Model A's.

FIX – When the Safety Fuse blows it is an indication that there is excessive amperage flowing in the wiring. Typical wiring harness wire size and amperages are #12 wire (20 amp), #14 wire (15 amp) and #16 wire (10 amp). A Headlight harness wire that shorts out to ground (back to the frame/chassis) can cause a 30-40 amp flow. If a Safety Fuse is installed the Fuse will blow and save the car from possibly catching on fire.

WARNING: A Safety Fuse does NOT protect the Battery cable from the Negative (-) post to the Starter Switch terminal which is routed away from the Brake Pedal arm and through a rubber bushing/bracket assembly to keep it from being worn away by the Brake Pedal arm and shorting to ground. If this cable becomes shorted then either the shorted wire needs MOVED away from what it is shorting to or either of the Battery cable clamps would need to be removed from the Battery Posts to stop the short.

# Off to Natchitoches, Louisiana Dec. 3-5 for a Historic Christmas Experience







With an open design, the Phaeton was not as commonly purchased as other Model A body styles.





